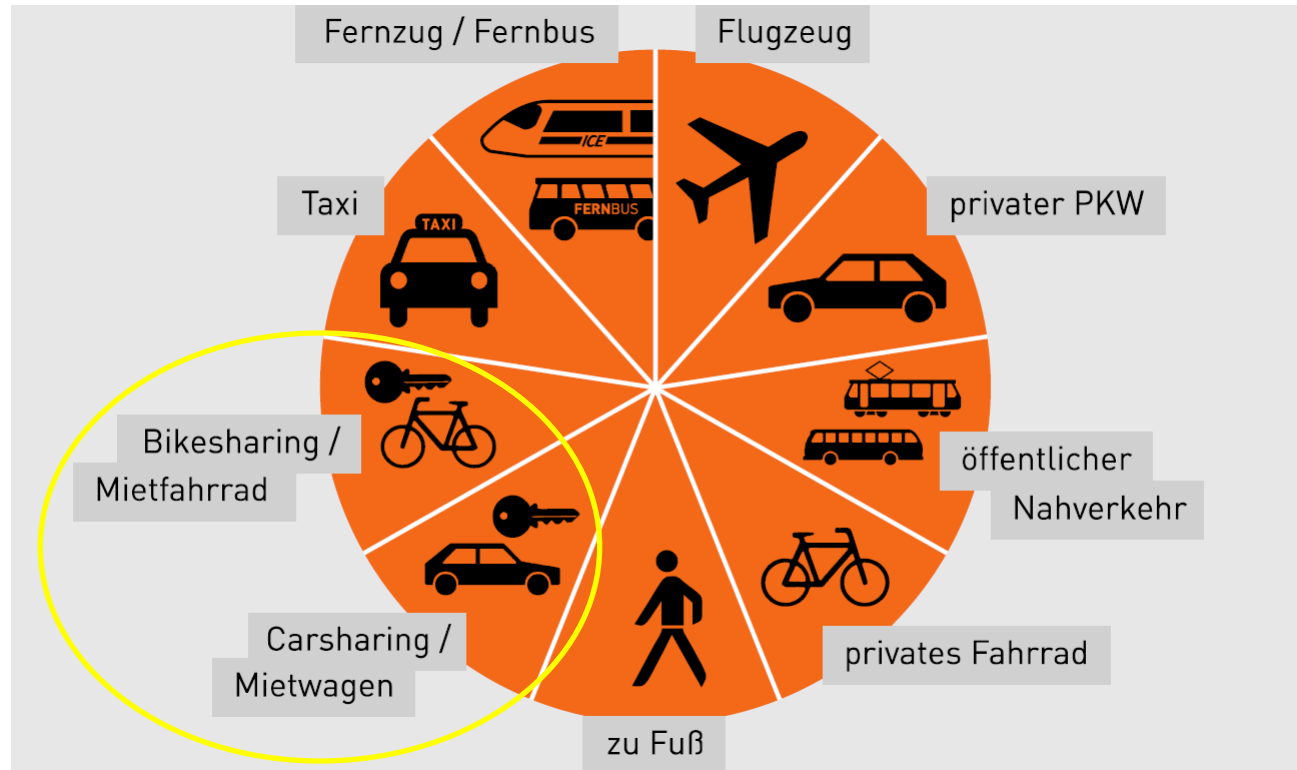

The state of carsharing in Germany

Beginning of the year 2016: 1,260,000 participants registered with 150 german carsharing providers

- „Classic“ carsharing: 430,000 participants
- „Free-floating“ carsharing: 830,000 participants
1,260,000 participants

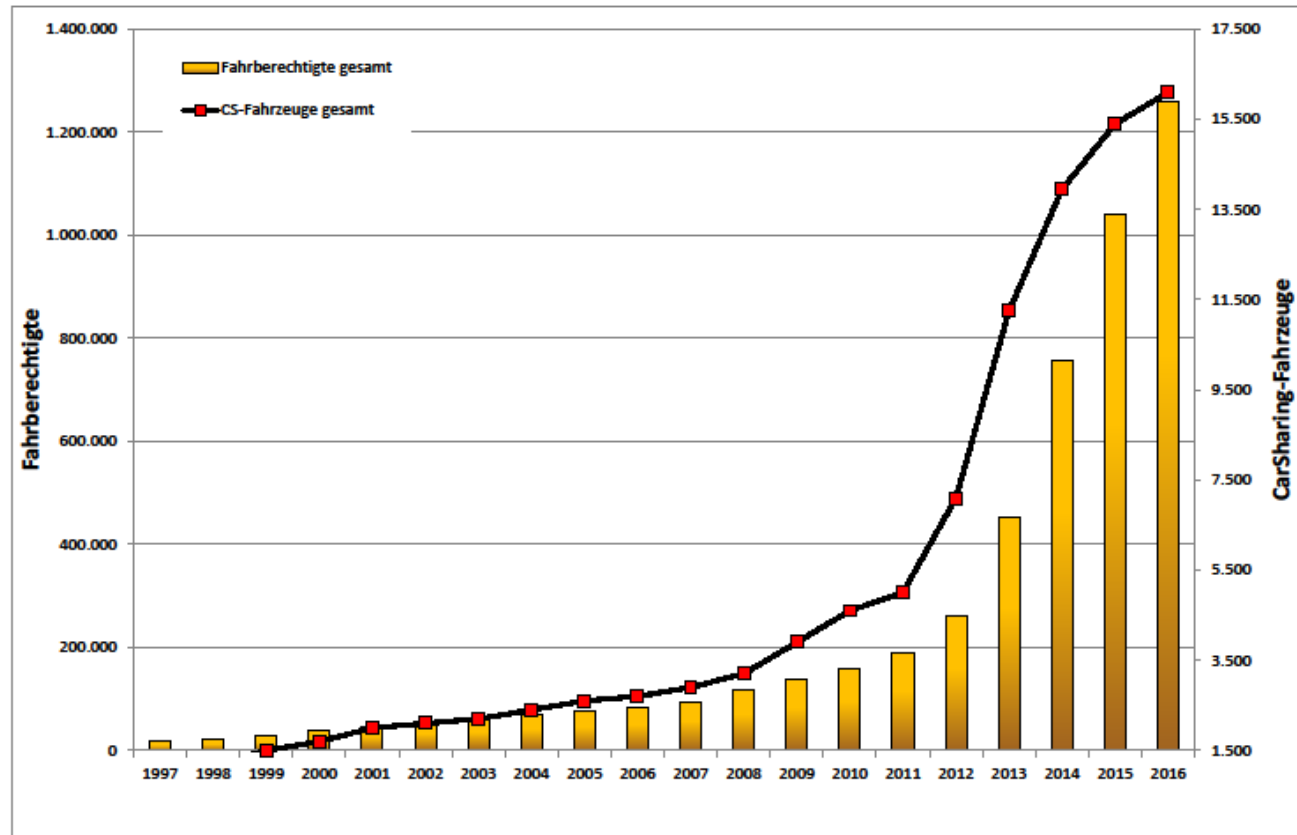
- „Classic“ carsharing: 9,100 cars (at 4,600 stations)
- „Free-floating“ carsharing: 7,000 cars
16,100 cars

- „Classic“ carsharing: 45 participants/car
- „Free-floating“ carsharing: 126 Participants/car

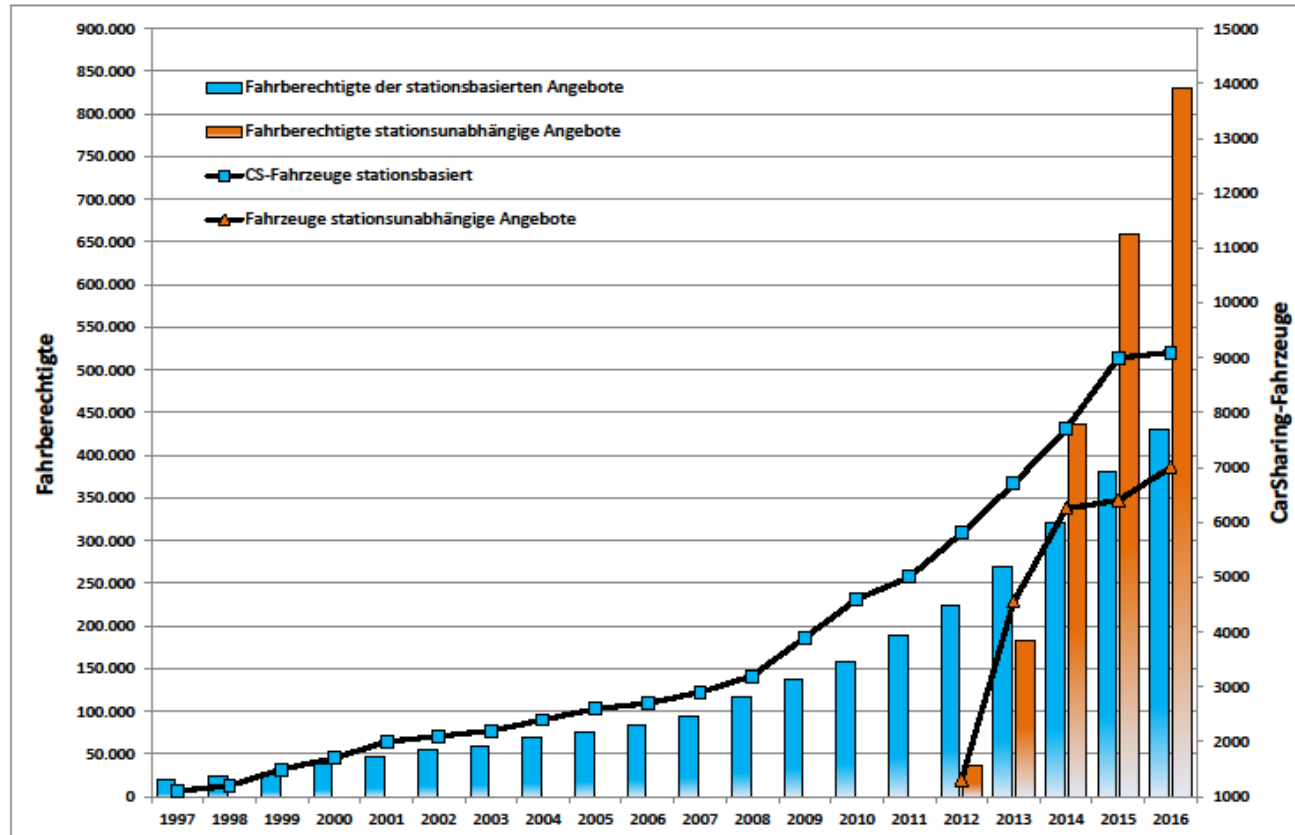
The development of carsharing in Germany (I)

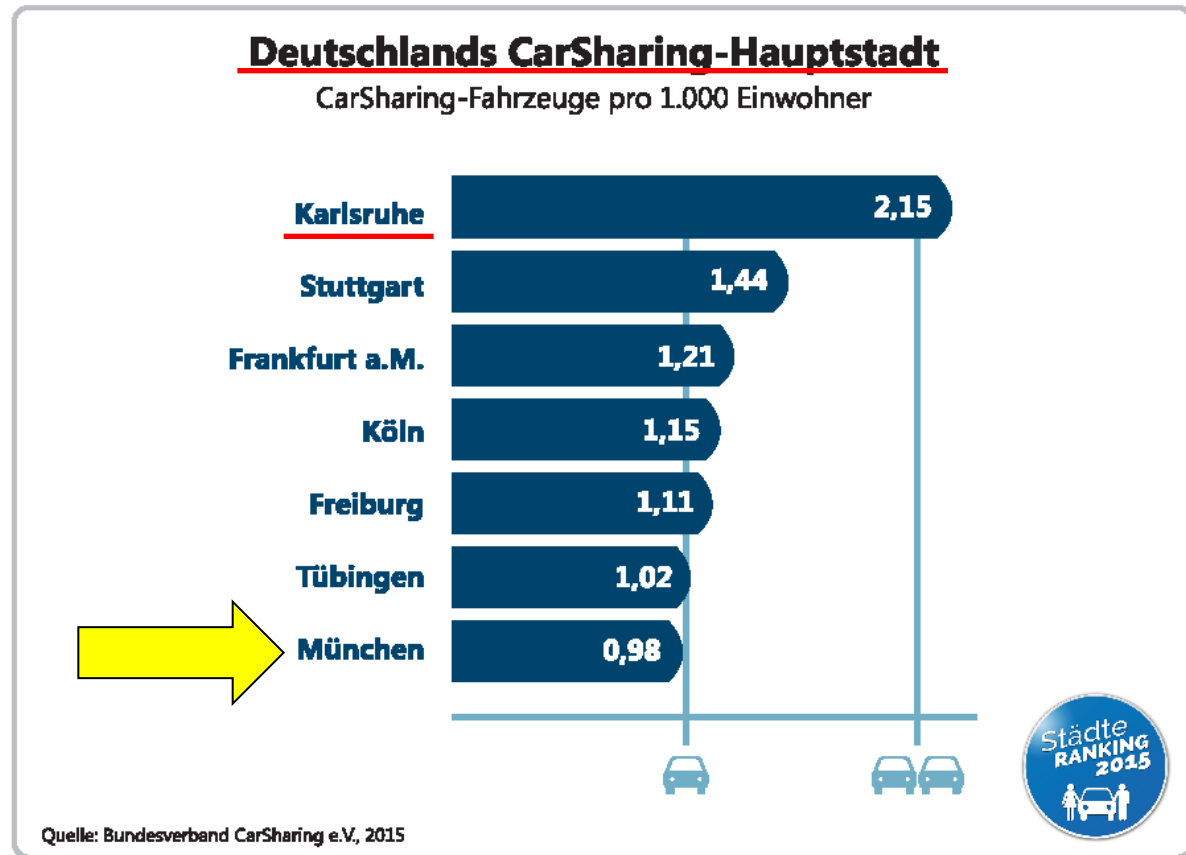
The ranking list of carsharing cities (I)

- Carsharing is available in 537 German towns and cities.
- Carsharing services are offered in 136 cities with more than 50,000 inhabitants (15 April 2015).
- The German carsharing capital is Karlsruhe (2,15 cars/1,000 inhabitants).
- A good offer in terms of carsharing services is not a privilege of big cities. Among the top ten, you can find three cities with less than 200,000 inhabitants: Tübingen, Heidelberg and Göttingen.
- Munich, the host of the **wocomoco 2017**, reaches the seventh position of the ranking list.

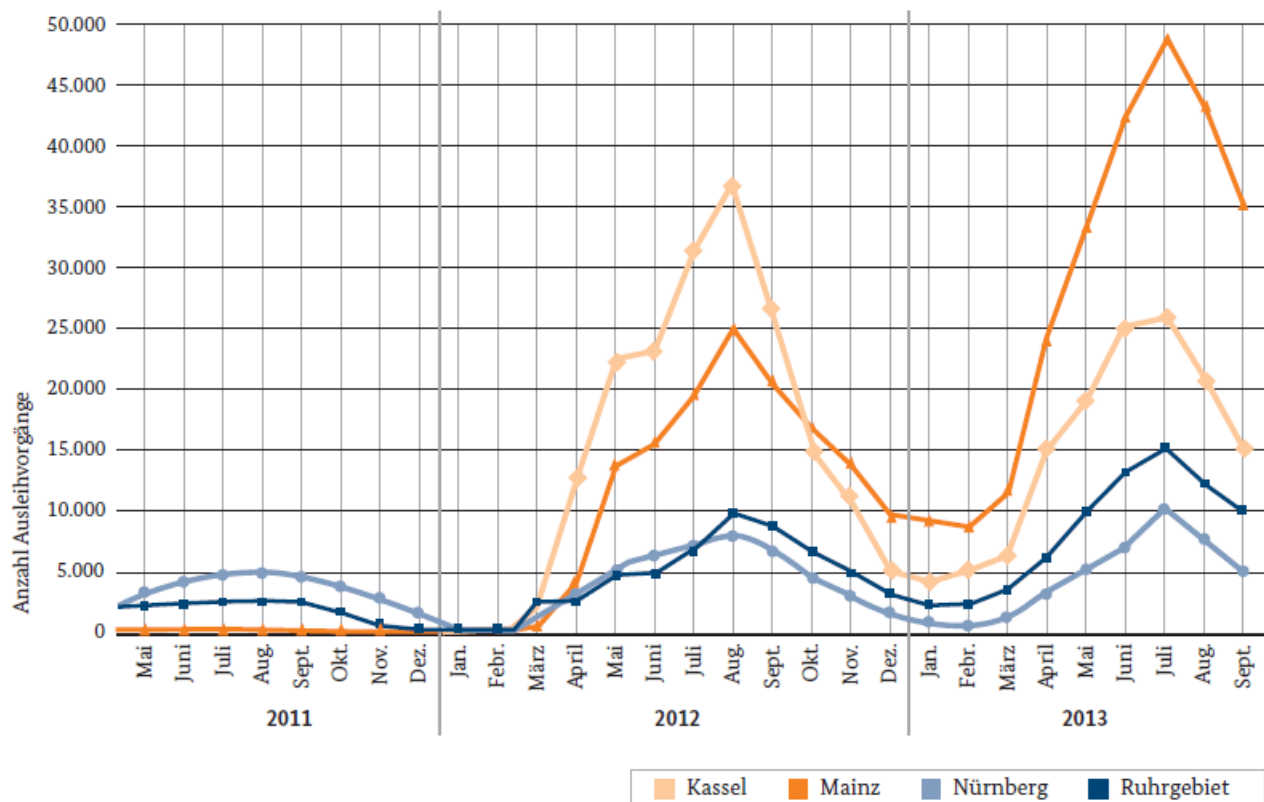
