On the occasion of the Global Sharing Day the mobility academy presents the first worldcongress on co-mobility

Mobility academy, Bern, 14 November 2012. On 22 and 23 May 2013 the mobility academy will for the first time hold the world collaborative mobility congress "wocomoco" in the Swiss Muesum of Transport in Luzern. This two-day event addresses established mobility-service providers, IT-Developers, as well as private and professional traffic-consumers. Next to thematic lectures, this international event also boasts an exhibition and an overview of the co-mobility networks that are available today. On 22 and 23 May 2013 the mobility academy will hold the first world collaborative mobility congress "wocomoco".
